Are you ready for the 16 month Accelerated Baccalaureate Option?

- 1. The 16-month option is demanding requiring a self-directed, disciplined person who takes responsibility for their own learning.
- 2. The 16-month option requires planning. It is, therefore, imperative to have strong back up plans for childcare and family needs in case something unexpected arises.
- 3. The 16 option program is fast-paced requiring students to be organized and have good time management skills.
- 4. The 16-month option requires integrity. Students must adhere to all university and program policies.
- 5. The 16-month option requires flexibility. Class, clinical, and simulation require availability seven days a week (including nights, evenings, and weekends). Changes in the schedule will occur and require adaptability with little notice.
- 6. The intense nature of the accelerated option may prohibit employment while in the 16-month option.
- 7. Financial planning should be addressed prior to the start of the program. An appointment with the financial aid office is encouraged.
- 8. Reliable transportation is required in getting to and from clinical settings. Some clinical experiences are outside the Colorado Springs area.
- 9. The ability to use a computer for online learning, communication, documentation, and accessing information is imperative.
- 10. Students will learn in a variety of venues (including simulation- both low and high fidelity, laboratory, clinical, classroom, and online) engaging in both individual and collaborative group work.
- 11. The 16-month option is rigorous offering little opportunity for review or remediation.
