

The Undergraduate Nursing Department Uniform for Clinical Areas is as follows:

1. All students will wear a scrub uniform that is embroidered with the UCCS Helen and Arthur E. Johnson Beth El College of Nursing and Health Sciences logo. Official logo available at AAA Uniforms **only**.
2. It is recommended that student purchase two sets of scrubs. If only one set is purchased, they must be laundered every day.
3. The scrubs are as follows: Cherokee scrubs with the following item numbers:
 - a. Tops – Female #4801 (XXS to 5XL) Males #4776 (white only)
 - b. Pants – Female #4200; Male #4000. (Black only) Women have the option to purchase the Male style #4100. For XXS, you will need approval by the Clinical Coordinator for alternate style number.
 - c. Uniforms can be purchased from AAA Uniforms.
 - d. If another site is utilized for the purchase of the black scrub pants, they must be high rise scrub pants. They may not be low-rise or drawstring pant and are to be solid black in color.
 - e. “Jogger” scrub pants are not allowed.
 - f. For maternity uniform, please contact Clinical Facilities Coordinator.
4. Uniforms must be the appropriate size, neat, clean, in good condition, and acceptable.
5. Undergarments must be worn, not be visible, and completely covered by the uniform. Long sleeve tops may be worn under the white scrub shirt if they are **white** in color.
6. A plain white scrub jacket (Cherokee # 4350 – Women, Cherokee WW360 - Men) may be worn with the uniform in accordance with hospital policy and must also be embroidered with UCCS Helen and Arthur E. Johnson Beth El College of Nursing and Health Sciences logo.
7. All students will wear the UCCS Beth-El Photo ID which will be affixed to the upper left front of the uniform.
8. Solid black shoes (without additional colors) be worn with the uniform. Black leather sport shoes can be worn. Shoes must be waterproof to prevent body fluid exposure in the event of a spill. No open toed shoes are allowed in the clinical area
9. Solid black socks or stockings must be worn.
10. Hair should be clean, professional in appearance, and in a natural occurring hair color. Hair should be worn back away from the face and secured to not interfere with professional duties. Beards and mustaches must be clean and neatly trimmed.
11. Jewelry must not jeopardize or interfere with patient safety and must be discreetly worn.
12. If the ears are pierced, only one pair of small stud earrings (non-dangling and do not cover the ear lobe) is permitted. Facial jewelry such as nose rings/studs or tongue rings/studs are not permitted. Other jewelry permitted include wedding rings, watches, and class rings.
13. The full black and white uniform is required for all hospital visits, including going to the hospital to pick up patient assignments unless otherwise stated in the course syllabus
14. Student will be allowed to wear Pro Packs/Nurse Packs in the clinical setting in the color of their choice.
15. Fingernails may be no longer than ¼ inch above the fingertip. If nail polish is worn, it should only approximate skin color and should be un-chipped. Artificial nails may NOT be worn at any time.
16. Perfume and gum chewing are not permitted in the clinical setting.
17. Helen and Arthur E. Johnson Beth-El student nametag or agency volunteer name tag must always be worn.

18. Tattoos may not be visible in the clinical area. Tattoos may only be visible in a clinical area if the department prohibits long sleeves
19. NO JEANS AT ANY CLINICAL SITE

The consequences of violations of the Undergraduate Nursing Student Dress Code will be determined by the clinical faculty member.
